

RESUME PROF DR. TOBIAS TRÖGER

Tobias Tröger currently is Professor of Private Law, Trade and Business Law and Jurisprudence at the House of Finance at Goethe-University Frankfurt am Main. He is also a Program Director at the Research Center Sustainable Architecture for Finance in Europe (SAFE) and an Associate Professor at the Institute of Monetary and Financial Stability (IMFS), two Frankfurt based think tanks devoted to providing research-based policy advice.

Tobias' scholarly interests span from contract law and theory to corporate law and governance, securities and banking regulation. His research is published in leading German, European and U.S. law reviews. It employs interdisciplinary methods and is particularly hospitable to economic approaches to law and its empirical analysis. One of his current focuses lies on the potential ramifications of the financial and sovereign debt crises for the corporate governance of financial institutions and for banking supervision.

Tobias *inter alia* advises the European Parliament on matters of banking supervision. His recent teaching experience includes visits to the University of Pennsylvania Law School and Stanford Law School. He is a graduate of Harvard Law School, Eberhard-Karls-University Tübingen and Ludwig-Maximilians-University Munich.
