II. The European Banking Institute

1. Overview

The European Banking Institute (hereafter also “**EBI**” or the “**Institute**”) has been created to develop a pan-European research centre for banking regulation and supervision, which mirrors the pan-European character and the set-up of the SSM (hub and spokes model). EBI focuses on high-quality research into the legal and economic aspects of banking regulation and supervision. The Institute will focus its work in research projects in the field of law, economics and accounting. The Institute shall endeavour to provide academic input to banking regulators, supervisors and the private sector in Europe.

The purpose of the Institute is to conduct high quality research, to distribute knowledge and to promote the dialogue between scholars, regulators, industry representatives and advisors in relation to issues concerning the regulation and supervision of financial institutions and financial markets from a legal, economic and any other related viewpoint. EBI will thus collaborate mainly with European academic institutions and the relevant public and private sector institutions.

At a second stage, the EBI endeavours to develop a policy centre with the target to establish a new truly pan-European think tank in the area of banking regulation, supervision and banking resolution and any related areas.
