The EBI Young Researchers Group (YRG)

In December 2017, the European Banking Institute established the Young Researchers Group for PhD researchers of European universities. The initiative is led by EBI Academic Board Members Profs. Matthias Haentjens and Ignacio Tirado, and coordinated by Lynette Janssen (Leiden University) and Agnieszka Smoleńska (European University Institute). Thus far the group is composed of 16 researchers from 13 European universities.

The newly founded YRG is an inter-disciplinary and international platform for exchange and mutual learning for early stage researchers in the rapidly developing area of banking law and policy. Under the wings of the EBI, the YRG will conduct research, promote debate and dialogue between young researchers in relation to issues concerning regulation and supervision of financial institutions and financial markets. Specific projects undertaken by the YRG Members include PhD Workshops organised in cooperation with EBI as well as research and assistance on EBI projects.

Members of the YRG of the EBI have the opportunity to present their research during several events a year, to meet scholars, regulators and industry representatives, to discuss their research with them, to organise events and to publish research papers with the EBI.
